

Job Site Cleaning and Disinfecting

Job site cleaning and disinfecting is a critical component to slowing the spread of COVID-19. Institute regular housekeeping practices, which includes cleaning and disinfecting frequently used tools and equipment and other elements of the work environment, where possible. Employees should regularly do the same in their assigned work areas. For example:

- Jobsite trailers and break/lunchroom areas should be cleaned at least once per day.
- Employees performing cleaning should be issued proper personal protective equipment, such as nitrile, latex or vinyl gloves and gowns, as recommended by the CDC.
- Any trash collected from the jobsite should be disposed of frequently by someone wearing nitrile, latex or vinyl gloves.
- Any portable jobsite toilets should be cleaned by the leasing company at least twice per week and disinfected on the inside. The company should ensure that hand sanitizer dispensers are always filled. Frequently touched items (e.g. door pulls and toilet seats) should be disinfected frequently.
- Vehicles and equipment/tools should be cleaned at least once per day and before any change in operator or rider.
- Disinfection should be conducted using one of the following:
 - Common EPA-registered household disinfectant;
 - Alcohol solution with at least 60% alcohol; or
 - Diluted household bleach solutions (these can be used if appropriate for the surface).
- Always maintain Safety Data Sheets of all disinfectants/cleaning products used on site.
